Group Size and Age of Students

UTC does not provide chaperones or counselors. Supervision is required. Please provide the following chaperone coverage: 1 adult per 25 students aged 13 to 18 is required. These supervisors will act as the liaisons between the UTC staff in the event of discipline, noise or disruptive behavior. UTC will require students' legal guardians to sign a liability waiver. Children under the age of 13 are not permitted to stay in on-campus housing. Minimum group size: 12 students.

#1 Rapidly Improve Your English

Students attend immersive English classes for 15-hours each week in the heart of UTC's beautiful campus, walking distance from the Tennessee Riverfront and steps away from downtown Chattanooga. Coursework includes language skills classes, American culture classes, and TOEFL preparation.

#2: Learn Outside of the Classroom

Program participants attend field trips and special events that foster cultural exchange and language development. They connect to other international students through problem solving, performance, and recreation.
